1. Entry deadline is due online **July 17, 2009** at the Lea County Fair Office.
2. *Should you have any questions regard entering online please contact the Fair Office (575)396-8686*
3. **Entry Fee** of \$2.00 will be assessed per Exhibitor, per entry. *If entering two (2) different dogs, the exhibitor owes \$4.00.*
4. There will be an overall high-point trophy given.
5. A parent/guardian or their 4-H leader should accompany 4-H MEMBERS. *Exhibitors are held responsible for the conduct of their dogs and are to take **every precaution** to prevent their dog from harming other people or dogs.*
6. The Lea County Fair, State 4-H Office or County Extension Office will not assume responsibility for injury to any participant, official, spectator or animal. Exhibitors are reminded that dogs are likely to be more nervous when brought to a show than when they are at home, and thus special care needs to be taken to avoid accidents.
7. No dogs allowed on the Fairgrounds except Monday, August 3, 2009. And then only those entered in the Dog Show are allowed on the grounds and those must be leashed.
8. **Premiums:** 1st - \$3.00; 2nd - \$2.00; 3rd - \$1.00, *The Hobbs Kennel Club may award additional premiums*

Special Rules:

1. All Exhibitors must present a certificate at check-in time indicating that their dogs have a current rabies and DHL inoculations.
2. Exhibitors and dog must be enrolled in the 4-H Dog Care and Training Project to participate in the 4-H Dog Show.
3. Members should be able to perform skills required of the class they are entering.
4. All dogs must be brought to the show on a training leash and training collar. Spike collars will not be allowed.
5. Female dogs in season must *not* be brought to the Fair Grounds.
6. Ill or diseased dogs must *not* be brought to the Fair Grounds.
7. All dogs exhibited must be at least six months old at time of show.
8. Exhibitors may show as many dogs as he or she wishes. *No more than one dog may be shown in each class.*
9. Obedience classes will be judged by American Kennel Club Standards.
10. The following classes will be offered in this show:
 - a. Pre-Novice A - Junior
 - b. Pre-Novice A - Senior
 - c. Pre-Novice B - Junior
 - d. Pre-Novice B - Senior
 - e. Novice - Junior
 - f. Novice - Senior
 - g. Graduate Novice
 - h. Open
 - i. Showmanship - Junior
 - j. Showmanship - Senior
11. Dogs must be trained exclusively by the Exhibitor during the project year beginning January 1, 2008 and ending December 30, 2008.

12. Exhibitor who have reached their fourteenth birthday on or before January 1, 2008 should enter Senior Classes.
All others should enter Junior Classes.
13. Classes not divided into Junior and Senior Divisions are open to all age groups.
14. Dogs shown in Pre-Novice, Novice or Graduate Novice classes **may not** compete in any other obedience classes.
15. Pre-Novice A classes are restricted to dogs that have had no training prior to December 1, 2008.
16. Pre-Novice B classes are restricted to Members who has trained a dog prior to December 1, 2008.
17. Dogs may be shown in Graduate Novice or Open Classes as often as the handler desires. *It is anticipated that all dogs will go on to open training unless they are physically incapable of jumping exercises.*
18. Showmanship classes will be judged by generally accepted standards for Junior Showmanship, utilizing the Washington State University guidelines and score sheet as found in Bulletin No. 670. This bulletin will be supplied upon request to Exhibitors by the Extension Office.
